Notes for future CPAs:

- To be licensed as a CPA, a student must complete 33 accounting credits, 36 business credits and 150 total credits. IDS1010: Mathematics for Business does **not** count towards the 36 business credits but **does** count towards the 150 total credits.
- The Sy Syms MSA is a New York State CPA Licensure Qualifying Registered Program. This program will help you become a CPA licensed in most states, including New York. Licensure requirements vary by state. Students are responsible for ensuring that they meet said requirements.
