Jewish Education Majors are required to take classes focusing Jewish Education, Jewish Studies, and General Education in addition to their regular SCW requirements.

### Jewish Education Requirements:

- 5 classes in Jewish Studies on the advanced level (one concentration in Bible [3 or 5 courses], with an option for a second concentration (2 courses) in JHIS, JPHIL, or JUDS)
  - These 5 classes are in addition to the basic JS requirements and distribution
- Teaching Jewish Studies (JEDU 2319, seminar in fall of junior year; includes fieldwork)
- Teaching Literacy (AGS)
- Teaching Bible (AGS)
- 3 semesters of field work (spring of sophomore year [JEDU 3215]; spring of junior year [JEDU 3216], and fall of senior year [JEDU 3218]) with corresponding seminar (1 credit each)
- 1 semester of student teaching (JEDU 3225) with corresponding seminar (JEDU 3226)

### Education Classes (Gen Ed Electives):

- 2807: Literature of Pedagogy
- 2201: Classroom Management
- Educational Psychology
- Education elective (either at SCW or AGS)

### General SCW Requirements:

- ENGL 1100: English Composition
- SPEE 1010: Speech Communications
- 4 courses of Foundations and Contemporary Perspectives, including PSYC 1010
- 3 courses of Literature & the Arts
- 2 courses Science & Technology
- 1 course of Quantitative Skills
- Jewish Studies requirements
