

Joint Stern College for Women and Wurzweiler School of Social Work

BA-MSW Program

Introduction

Stern College for Women (SCW) offers a five-year program in conjunction with the Wurzweiler school of Social Work (WSSW) leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree from SCW and Master of Social Work degree from WSSW.

During the first 3 years of this 3-2 program students complete the undergraduate General Education requirements, an adjusted Jewish Studies requirement, and 18 credits of a Shaped Major in Human Services. Qualified students then enter the two-year Master's program at WSSW in the fall of their senior year.

Credits needed to complete the major and to reach the 128-credit minimum required for the B.A. degree are counted back from WSSW.

Eligibility

Interested students should meet with an Academic Advisor during their first semester on campus to plan a course of study. Students must complete 109 undergraduate credits of which 72 must be taken at SCW.

A minimum GPA of 3.0 is required.

1 year in Israel (27 credits) and 4 semesters + summer at SCW

Students admitted to the program pay undergraduate tuition in their first year at WSSW and graduate tuition in their second year at WSSW.

After successfully completing the SCW requirements and the first year at WSSW, students may apply for the B.A. degree through the Office of the Undergraduate Registrar. They may apply for the Master of Social Work degree upon successful completion of the Master's program.
