## **STUDIO FOUNDATION REQUIREMENTS (9 credits)**

Foundation courses should be taken early in the sequence (preferably the first 3 semesters on campus), and are intended as pre-requisites for both SCW and FIT intermediate and advanced level electives.

## STUDIO ELECTIVE REQUIREMENTS (7 courses, maximum of 3 at FIT)

- Four (4) in the student's area of emphasis (12 credits)
- Three (3) additional elective courses

SCW will pay for up to 3 FIT courses (FIT courses are generally 1.5–2 credits and meet once per week). All Studio Art majors must meet with Professor Tullius to plan appropriate courses for their area of emphasis.

Students must take at least one studio course at SCW before registering at FIT.

## **SENIOR PROJECT** (1 credit)

ARTS 4974/4975	Pre-Senior Project/Senior Project	1

ARTS 4974/4975 is a 2-semester course and must be taken by the term a student expects to graduate.

A January graduate would register for Pre-Senior Project in the Spring semester prior to graduation, and for Senior Project in the final Fall semester. A May graduate would register for Pre-Senior Project in the Fall, and Senior Project in her final Spring semester.

The Senior Project consists of an independent studio project designed by the student to reflect her area of emphasis. Completion and presentation of the student's Senior Project as well as participation in the annual Stern Senior art exhibition at the YU Museum are required.
